## ANNUAL MEMBER SURVEY

Thanks to the 111 members who completed the annual Member Survey! We use the annual survey to get direct feedback from members on a wide range of issues, including guidance on AAWGT's future direction.

The survey tells us that members are often surprised to learn, through participation with AAWGT, of the depth and extent of need in Anne Arundel County. The number of nonprofits working to improve the lives of women and families in the county also impresses our members.

Highlights of issues for which a clear majority of the respondents were in agreement:

- 74% want to grow the size of our membership. Among the comments, an increase in growth is seen as a means to increase our grant pool. Some respondents expressed concern that growing the membership would pose logistic challenges.
- 66% agreed we should keep our annual contribution at \$550 to keep membership widely affordable.
- 74% are willing to support an increase in the administrative fee from \$50 to \$75 to support the costs of our grants software and website software.
- When asked to select core values reflected by AAWGT, 70% of respondents selected "informative", 69% selected "collaborative," and 66% selected "meaningful". These responses suggest that membership sees AAWGT as a group that works together to learn and to serve the needs of women and families in Anne Arundel County.

The individual responses on what AAWGT means to each members, and thoughts and suggestions on how to improve the organization make for interesting reading. ## **YOUR DOLLARS AT WORK**

### **YWCA of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County:**

Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Therapeutic Services for Women & Children

Over the past 12 months, the YWCA of Annapolis and Anne Arundel County has served 50 women who experienced domestic abuse or violence in their lives. The AAWGT Grant awarded in 2014, supported therapeutic crisis intervention to victims and their children through the Counseling Center, while also providing referrals to safe house shelters, legal services, support services and additional emergency resources to ensure a continuum of care. The YWCA recently added Art Therapy to their more traditional therapy. First utilized following WWII, Art Therapy uses creativity and imagination to restore a sense of possibility, identity and reconnection for victims who have been silenced by violence. Talking about abuse is difficult. Sharing their art furnishes a coming back to who they were.

## **WHAT'S NEW ON THE WEBSITE?**

### **New Design and More Membership Features**

AAWGT's [new website](#) look was launched on July 15. The new design is fully responsive, meaning the website adjusts to display on phones, tablets and desktop computers. AAWGT's web masters (our very own members, Eve-Marie Lacroix and Bronwyn Belling) have streamlined the menus to simplify finding what you need quickly and easily. At the same time, the membership application and renewal process have been automated to save time and improve communication. New website features include:

- AAWGT's Facebook feed and newsletter sign-up are featured at the bottom of the Home page.
- The Membership Application form now appears on the Join Us page, making it easier for prospective members to join.
- The Members Only page includes photos of our members from the Membership Directory and also features Steering Committee members' photos and position.
- When logged in as a member, you will see the upcoming events that are restricted to members.
- The renewal process has been automated, based on a member's initial join date.

## **Members Have Unique Access**

When a member logs in to the website, they have access to information that is not available to the general public. The membership directory includes phone and email contact information, as well as a photograph of each member who has posted her picture. So far, 77 members' photos are posted on the website -- our goal is to have a photo of every member. ## **WHAT OUR MEMBERS ARE READING**

Book ideas from speakers and members were circulated at the June 10 Education Meeting on "The Myths of Poverty."

Speaker Reverend Dr. Carlotta Allen recommended *The New Jim Crow* as providing insight into how incarceration exacerbates the problems of poverty. *The Myth of the Welfare Queen* addresses some myths of poverty directly by sharing stories of the lives of several women living in poverty in Philadelphia. Finally, *The Warmth of Other Suns* was mentioned multiple times by different members and received high marks when the AAWGT book group read it.
